Packaging and Packaging Waste regulation

The product and its packaging comply with all applicable legal requirements in force at the time of being placed on the market, including Directive 94/62/EC. For Regulation (EU) 2025/40 (PPWR), compliance is confirmed where relevant provisions are currently applicable. Future requirements are subject to ongoing implementation and regulatory clarification.

Environmental Aspects**Product**

The paper is made from renewable sources and contains only virgin fibres.

PFAS (per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances) are **not** being used in any step of the manufacturing of the products covered by this data sheet.

Packaging

The corrugated board box is unbleached and to a large extent made of recycled fibres.

Labelling

The paper bags are FSC certified.

Product Safety

The product fulfils the following:

- Article 5 of Regulation (EU) 2025/40 on Packaging and Packaging Waste (PPWR) regarding the levels of heavy metals (Lead (Pb), Cadmium (Cd), Mercury (Hg) and hexavalent chromium (Cr VI). The sum must not exceed 100 mg/kg (100 ppm) in packaging or any packaging component.
- The paper used in the bags are tested in accordance with European Commission Resolution AP 2002 on paper and board materials for antimicrobial constituents, benzophenone and 4-methylbenzophenone, PCP and heavy metals.

- Duni manufacturing units are certified according to the international quality system ISO 9001. They have also implemented the environmental management system ISO 14001.

End of Life

Recycling

Collection, sorting and material recovery are all part of the recycling process. Recycling is dependent on local waste handling infrastructure.

Used products should be handled according to local regulations, for best guidance, please check with local waste handling company.

Recycling of the packaging material is possible.

Energy Recovery

Incineration facilities for energy recovery are dependent on local infrastructure. Incineration for energy recovery is a good alternative when material recovery is not available by recycling.
