Wooden cutlery (for cutlery packs a napkin is included)

Material

Cutlery: Waxed birch wood (Carnauba wax E903)

Napkin: Virgin tissue

Packaging

Inner: Polyethylene (PE). Cutlery packs are packed in a paper sachet.

Outer: Corrugated board box

Area of Use

The cutlery can be used safely with all types of food, serving cold or hot up to 70°C.

The cutlery is not suitable to be used in a microwave oven.

Various foods may affect the physical properties of wood. Duni advises customers to test their applications for suitability.

Packaging and Packaging Waste

The product and its packaging comply with all essential requirements set out in Directive 94/62/EC on packaging and packaging waste, as well as the forthcoming Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR), Regulation (EU) 2025/40.

Environmental Aspects**Product**

The cutleries are made from birch wood which is a renewable source.

The cutleries are FSC certified according to "Mixed Sources" certification number DNV-COC-000148.

PFAS (per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances) are **not** being used in any step of the manufacturing of the products covered by this data sheet.

Packaging

Polyethylene is used for packaging purposes and derived from fossil sources.

The corrugated board box is unbleached and to a large extent made of recycled fibres.

Product Safety

The product fulfils the following:

- Article 3, 11(5), 15 and 17 of Regulation (EC) No 1935/2004 (Framework regulation)
- EU Regulation 2023/2006/EC (GMP - Good Manufacturing Practice)
- Analysis has been performed according to LFGB (Lebensmittel- und Futtermittelgesetzbuch, Germany Regulation).
- Duni manufacturing units are certified according to the international quality system ISO 9001. They have also implemented the environmental management system ISO 14001.

End of Life

Recycling

Collection, sorting and material recovery are all part of the recycling process. Recycling is dependent on local waste handling infrastructure.

Although made from natural materials, the wooden cutlery is not suitable for composting or disposal with food waste, as it does not break down within the required timeframe. As there is typically no dedicated recycling system for wood cutlery, it should be disposed of with residual (general) waste. For further details, local waste-management guidelines should be consulted for accurate disposal instructions.

Packaging materials may be recyclable; follow local recommendations.

Energy Recovery

Incineration facilities for energy recovery are dependent on local infrastructure. Incineration for energy recovery is a good alternative when material recovery is not available by recycling.
